PUBLIC ACCOUNTS COMMITTEE (PAC)

STANDARD PROGRAM AND 2024 WORK PLAN

1. Background

The mandate and the role of the Public Accounts Committee is set out in the Standing Orders and the Expenditure Review and Audit Act, Cap 241. Some responsibilities of the PAC are also outlined in the Public Finance and Economic Management Act.

As per Standing orders 68, it is required that the Chair present a list of matters to be enquired into or examined by the committee in the 12 months following. The Expenditure Review and Audit Act denotes that the PAC can meet once in a month or as required by the Committee. Under the provisions of the current standing orders, I, Hon Ulrich Sumptoh, as Chairman of PAC, I am honoured to present this work program and 2024 work plan.

2. Standard Annual Program

4.1 Aim of work program

This work program aims to:

- Provide for consistency in the meetings of PAC each year.
- Ensure that the roles and responsibilities of PAC are attended to within a year and in a sustainable manner, and
- Ensure that PAC reports to Parliament on both ordinary session of Parliament.
- 2.2 Standard Program

For this 13th legislature, the standard program for PAC aims to ensure PAC fulfill its mandate as set out in the Standing Orders and meets its objectives as set out in the Expenditure Review and Audit Act (ERAA).

4. 2024 Budget

The estimated budget for the 2024 work plan for PAC is Vt. 28 million. The details of the 2024 budget are as follows:

PAC requires an additional Vt.10,063,988 million to the already stated Vt17, 897,722 million in the 2024 budget report.

Apart from its normal undertakings, in this 2024 work plan, PAC will review the financial performance of Government Schools and Hospital of Malekula and undertake a public consultation on Budget and government expenditure in Luganville.

PAC will require an extra Vt. 10,063,988 million to successfully implement this 2024 work plan.
